There was a grocery shop in town. Many mice loved it as they could find food easily there. They ate all the food and spoiled all the bags in the shop.

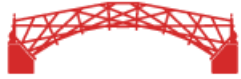
The shopkeeper got worried and thought of a solution, "I will buy a cat and let it stay in the shop." The cat had a good time hunting and killing the mice in the shop.

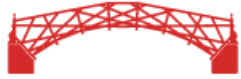

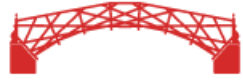
